Vice President Candidate: Jeremy Smith

She presented at different conferences like The ACTFL Annual Convention and World Languages Expo, National Chinese Language Conference (NCLC), New York State Association of Foreign Language Teachers (NYSAFLT) Annual Conference, New York International Conference on Chinese Teaching, Project for Developing Chinese Language Teachers (DCLT) of New York University's Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development. She holds master degrees in Teaching Chinese (K-12), and Teaching English to speakers of other languages (TESOL) from the New York University.
